Coloured deer handle, German silver, Damascus steel and leather, Karl Schmidt / Baden, Austria. Hand-forged, braided Damascus steel blade with 200 layers of 12842 and 75Ni8. 33/AU4
- 5. Collectors' handcrafted knife**
Stabilised mammoth molar, stainless steel and Damascus steel, Two 4 Sharp Art / Scheibbs, Austria. Fittings engraved by a master craftsman from Ferlach. 34/AU5
- 6. Sword blade**
Damascus steel, Austria. 35/AU6
- 7. Axe**
Wood, hand-forged, Gränsfors Bruk / Austria. 208/AU7
- 8. Old-style Puukko**
Birch bark, brass, 1080 steel and leather, master knife-maker Arto Liukko / Finland. 45/FI4
- 9. Sissipuukko M.95**
Technoplastic, 80CrV2 steel and polypropylene, J.P. Peltonen / Finland. 47/FI6
- 10. Eppu**
Granadilho wood, silver-plated brass, RWL-34 steel and leather, master knife-maker Jukka Hankala / Finland. 44/FI3
- 11. Riffle**
Carbon fibre, titanium, N690Co steel and leather, Tapio Syrjälä / Finland. 46/FI5
- 12. Puukko**
Birch wood and bark, and 115CrV3 steel, master knife-maker Pasi Jaakonaho / Finland. 43/FI2
